Massimo Clemente (Naples, 1962) is Research Director in Urban planning and design in the National Research Council of Italy. Graduated in Architecture at the Federico II University of Naples, Corsicato Foundation Award (1987), specialization in Restoration of Monuments and Historical Cities got in the same university.

He has worked in the CNR (1994-today) and in the University Federico II (2003-today) where he has coordinated several research projects, post graduate teaching and experimentation on the field.

Action-Research activities regard urban planning and urban regeneration, with focus on sea-city-region systems, coastal urban areas and ports.

Since 1994 he has taught in the Universities of Campania L. Vanvitelli, Naples Federico II, Rome Tor Vergata and Uninettuno, Genoa and Palermo. In 2013 he has got the national qualification as full professor in "Urban and regional planning and design".

The study activity is accompanied by experimentation on the field and dissemination, with particular reference to the contribution of planning and architecture to sustainable local development and urban regeneration.

In Action-Research perspective, procedures are developed with stakeholders through collaborative processes: local actors, local authorities, associations, communities, etc.

In 1997 and 2001 he won the Della Rocca Foundation Award for monograph of research in the field of urban planning. He has participated in several national and international design competitions winning in 2011 the Competition for the Master Plan Nichelino 2010 (Turin, Italy) as team leader.
